
LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL

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STUDENTS SERVING THE COMMUNITY

Following a long-time tradition, SMS students gave of their time and talents to support a remarkable number of community service events this year.

- THANKSGIVING FOOD DRIVE Students very generously donated 716 pounds of food and collected more than \$1,300 for the purchase of hams and turkeys for the annual Thanksgiving food drive benefiting families served by St. Joseph's Family Center.
- CHRISTMAS TOY DRIVE For the SMS annual Advent project, students donated and helped



- ST. FRANCIS OF ASSISI ANIMAL RESCUE As a second Advent project, students generously donated bleach, paper towels, kitchen bags, dryer sheets, laundry detergent, and bath towels to St. Francis of Assisi Animal Rescue, which rescues and finds homes for abandoned, neglected, stray and surrendered dogs and cats.
- LORD'S TABLE During the school year, 4th through 8th grades rotated each month and served hot meals at the Lord's Table, a program that serves meals to the homeless and low-income families in our community. While too young to serve, Kinders through 3rd grade also contributed by collecting new socks, making



hygiene bags, creating Valentine cards, and many other contributions to support the clients who attend the Lord's Table.

- PENNIES FOR PATIENTS To support Catholic Schools Week with a service project, SMS teamed up with the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society, which is the world's largest voluntary health organization dedicated to funding blood cancer research and providing education and access to treatment for patients. The school set a goal of collecting \$1,500 but surpassed the goal by 20% and instead collected \$1,810!
- ITALIAN CATHOLIC FEDERATION (ICF) Our junior high students earned service hours working at the Polenta Dinner and the Annual Taste of Italy Peeled Shrimp & Ravioli Dinner. Students worked hard helping with set-up, serving during the events, and cleanup after the events. ICF has been a long-time supporter of our 8th grade graduation scholarship program, and we are pleased that our students can give back to the ICF with their time.
- ST. MARY SCHOOL IN ZIMBABWE For this year's Lenten Mission service project, the annual rummage sale generated funds that were donated to St. Mary Catholic School in Zimbabwe, Africa. Founded in 1935 by Catholic missionaries, the school has 850 students and 20 teachers, and while the school has computers, it does not have funds to cover the \$90 monthly fee for Internet access. From SMS' rummage sale and a 6th grade bake sale, St. Mary School made a total donation of almost \$1,300 to our sister school in Zimbabwe.
- RELAY FOR LIFE Again this year, students collected cans of food, which were used in the luminaries for the Relay for Life event to support the American Cancer Society's research efforts and cancer patient assistance. At the end of the event, the cans were donated to St. Joseph's Family Center.
- ... and our junior high students continued to put in many service hours within the SMS and Gilroy communities working toward their service blocks for graduation!

STUDENTS AND CATHOLIC IDENTITY

As a Catholic school, we are committed to providing the best learning experience possible for our students in an active Christ-centered Catholic community. In addition to religion taught in the classroom, SMS also offers numerous events throughout the year for students to share and experience their faith.

- Students celebrated the 5th grade at a Mass to bless their new **Bibles**, an annual tradition at St. Mary School.
- Always a popular event, Fr. Gener blessed our students' furry, feathered and scaly friends during the traditional Blessing of the Animals in celebration of the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, patron saint of animals.
- Students performed the annual Advent Program for families and guests with a play, Sheep in Heavenly Peace, by the 8th grade reflecting the story of the Nativity supported by the rest of the grades in band and song performances on the altar.
- Students and their art instructor created an Installation Nativity
 Art Scene in the school lobby to celebrate the Christmas season. The scene measured 10 feet tall by 12 feet wide. The project concept came from Peru and was designed to give the school a beautiful Nativity scene and also to teach new cultural traditions that



broadened the students' knowledge about Christmas celebrations in other countries.

- Catholic Schools Week kicked off with a family Mass followed by activities throughout the week celebrating Catholic schools in the community and nation; and our Catholic faith within our faculty, staff, parent, student and volunteer groups. The week began with a proclamation by Gilroy Mayor (and parishioner) Roland Velasco pronouncing Catholic Schools Week and culminated with the 19th Annual Grandparents Day where students honored their grandparents with a Mass, brunch and class performances.
- During Lent, in commemoration of Jesus' last days on Earth as a man, students acted out the Stations of the Cross each week, and the 8th grade performed the Passion on Holy Thursday.
- After preparing all year, our 2nd grade received the Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion.



The class had a wonderful retreat in celebration, and the school held a beautiful Mass to celebrate the 2nd grade students' new status in the church.

 As a beautiful spring tradition, St. Mary School students brought flowers from home and had a procession for the annual May Crowning in honor of Mary, the Blessed Mother.

ST. MARY SCHOOL JOINS THE DREXEL SCHOOL SYSTEM!

After much research and consideration with the principal, parish pastor, faculty, staff and parent leaders, St. Mary School decided to apply for and was accepted into the Drexel School System in the Diocese of San Jose beginning with the 2017-2018 school year. After looking at the data, evaluating the effectiveness and impact of joining the Drexel School System; observing teachers, curriculum and students in current Drexel schools; and assessing the benefits for our school, the decision was made that becoming a Drexel school was in the best interest of SMS.

What does this mean for the school?

Four pillars make up the Drexel System: accessibility, achievement, accountability and Catholic authenticity. Through additional Drexel funding combined with the current tuition assistance program, SMS is making a Catholic education accessible for all who want it. The school will receive increased instructional resources, training and support

for teachers; increased professional collaboration for the sharing and development of best practices to support student learning; increased on-campus resources for instruction and integration of best practices for teachers and administration; the opportunity to be part of a collaborative system of schools committed to continuous improvement; funding for building improvements and a technology upgrade; and professional development partnership for teachers with Santa Clara University. Most importantly, the students



will receive increased benefits in the classroom through new models of teaching using additional technology, small group sessions, and the ability for the teacher to easily scale instruction up or down depending on individual student needs.

We are excited to have the opportunity to join the Drexel System. The support for our entire school community and the promise of improvement for the instructional experiences for our students and professional development experience for our teachers will be amazing opportunities. Looking to the future, we believe it is the perfect time to take our school to the next level and are confident we will benefit greatly from joining the Drexel School System.

Speaking as a survivor of a brutal attack at a 2011 Giants-Dodgers baseball game, Bryan Stow talked with students in kindergarten through 8th grade about what it means to be a bully, the effects of bullying, and how to recognize and prevent it.

- GILROY CHAMBER OF COMMERCE To gain exposure for St. Mary School in the business community, SMS joined the Gilroy Chamber of Commerce this year. In addition to networking opportunities to spread the word about what SMS offers, the school has marketing and networking benefits through its membership, and during Catholic Schools Week, we hosted a ribbon cutting ceremony to celebrate our membership.
- 2017 GILROY ART & WINE STROLL St. Mary School is getting out into the community more, and for the first time, participated with an information table in the annual Gilroy Art & Wine Stroll.
